Grace and peace to you all.

Sometimes a sermon in Merredin contains statements that might be controversial, and the Elders have to decide whether or not to post it on-line to avoid misinterpretation. Last Sunday Kevin made some comments about certain politicians and we had a discussion about whether it was appropriate to post the full sermon, or better to cut those bits out.

We are often shy about making political statements in the church, saying faith and politics shouldn't mix. The Australian media often ask politicians known to have a strong religous faith if they will be able to make decisions without letting their faith influence them as if that's a bad thing. But that shows a fundamental misunderstanding of what faith is. If our faith is central to who we are, and gives us our values and sense of moral purpose and meaning, how can it not influence all our decisions and attitudes, including our political ones?

As Mike Fawcett points out in his video on labels today (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Q17GHBdS-00) Evangelical Christianity has become conflated with rightwing politics over the past 50 years. But this has not always been the case. In the 18th and 19th centuries John Wesley and William Wiberforce, impeccably evangelical, were at the forefront of the campaign to abolish slavery in Britain, at the time very radical.

There is diversity of political opinion in the Church, and the people who hold those opinions can often provide good reasons based on their understanding of the faith. We should not shy away from expressing our opinions, but we should do so in a way that is respectful and focuses on issues rather than individuals. And what does God require of us? To do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God. What could be more political than that?
